

Lake Titicaca Adventure

We have made amazing progress on our trek and because of that, we have decided to add an adventure by hiking all around the Lake. We will travel through several Peruvian towns along the shoreline of the lake before crossing into Bolivia and visiting Puerto Acosta and the Aymara people. They are an indigenous people in the Andes with the most significant population in Bolivia, more than 1.5 million. Pictured is an Aymara man beside his reed boats.



You can use the map as we hike along the shoreline, enjoying the views as we go. When we get around to Copacabana, we will hire a boat to take us out to Isla de Sol. It is one of the over 42 islands in the lake. There are over 80 Inca ruins on the island and no paved roads. Many hills on the island contain agricultural Terraces, which adapt the steep rocky Terrain to farming.
